We each recruited a Prayer Team that would pray for us and the Los Pinos family.




We knew God was preparing us for His work.

We were to fly out on Thursday, March 19 and Guatemala announced the border closure on March 16.




Our long-awaited trip was now impossible. And we we so sad.

We told ICC to use the \$3700 we had paid for project supplies and meals for whatever they needed.


Dear Sus Manos,

Every morning we had our individual "quiet time" of reading God's word and praying.








For ten days, we met via Zoom each morning to share what we had learned during our morning quiet time with God.

Profe wrote daily suggested missions, with something to read, a video to watch and something to do.






We divided up the names and prayed for our Los Pinos kids each day.




Los Pinos
